Radhika Lalit - 2015

As an EDF Climate corps fellow, Radhika helped Blue Shield of California plan for implementing solar at facilities owned by them. Three years later the company launched its solar installation which is estimated to avoid over 800 metric tons of CO2 each year. Now a Manager with Rocky Mountain Institute, Radhika is leading the Global Cooling Prize – an international competition to develop efficient and affordable air conditioning solutions for millions of people across the globe.

Daniel Katzenberger - 2018

As an EDF Climate Corps fellow, Daniel helped Best Buy shape a carbon and energy reduction goal that conformed to the Science-Based Targets Initiative. Post-fellowship, Daniel stayed on to help design the company's approach to reducing Scope 3 GHG emissions, enabling Best Buy to announce an innovative goal that would help consumers reduce their carbon emissions 20% by 2030 and to save an estimated \$5 billion over this timeframe.

Recruit

Recruiting occurs through on-campus information sessions around the country, webinars and attendance at the Net Impact conference.





We have two application deadlines, December 2nd, 2019 and January 6th, 2020. If you apply by December, you get access to a more robust list of companies.



Nominate

EDF will provide an up-to-date list of participating organizations and projects. You can indicate organizations you have a high interest in during the interview process, but cannot apply for a specific host organization.



Interview

Your interviews are conducted via Skype. Early applicant interviews are in January to mid-February and regular applicant interviews are in mid-February to March.



Matches with host companies will happen at the end of February for early applicants and at the end of March for regular applicants. You have two weeks to accept.



After you accept the match, we connect you with your potential host organization supervisor for final confirmation.
